Honor One Another - Romans 12:10

Rom. 12:10 Be devoted to one another in brotherly love. Honor one another above yourselves.

This is an easy verse to follow through with when we're talking about someone who we believe is honorable. However, what do we do when we're talking about someone who we don't believe is honorable?
